1. Skill Development Centre

Skill development centres are set up in various locations to provide skill development courses for the unemployed, poor and destitute women/children, for these people living in poverty to transform their lives.

Here is an update from tailoring skill development centres.

64 women completed course successfully: 9 women from kuzhipanthandalam village received certificates on 6th Mar 2017! 11 women from padapai village received certificates on 12th Mar 2017! 6 women from kothimangalam village received certificates on 13th Mar 2017! 11 women from Parthikulam village received certificates on 30th Mar 2017! 14 women from chenna samundhram village received certificates on 31st Mar 2017! 13 women from Vadapatanam village received certificates on 31st Mar 2017! Let us wish them good luck in becoming financially stable.



95 women commenced their training: On 7th Feb 2017, 17 women started their training in payanur village! On 9th Feb 2017, 14 women started their training in veeranatham village! On 17th Mar 2016,



10 women started their training in kunathur village. On 20th Mar 2017, 12 women started their training in Melakotaiur village. On 21st Mar 2017, 14 women started their training in padapai village. On 30th Mar 2017, 14 women started their training in parthikulam village. On 31st Mar 2017, 14 women started their training in Chennasamudhram village. I came to know about this free tailoring course conducted in our village by Ebendavid Charities. I approached them and joined this course. After completing six months of training at Ebendavid, I learnt how to cut clothes for dress making and stitch all kinds of dresses. Now I am earning an extra Rs.400 to 500 per week from home. 2. Nehemiah Care Projects

Our Nehemiah Care Centre continues to provide simple life changing care to uplift the life of the poor, needy and the helpless in distress.

Micro programs to break the cycle of poverty:

Micro skill development programs was organized in Rantham village of Thiruvanamalai dist. on 4th April 2017 and in Thalangai village of Kanchipuram district on 20th April 2017, to the benefit of the people living below the poverty line. The participants were taught simple skills to make some extra money.

At Rantham village 29 women attended this program and at Thalangai village 15 women attended this program. In these micro training programs variety of skills were demonstrated and taught. The first part of the training were for basket making, creative designs with newspaper, decorative items from ice cream sticks and the second part of the training was for commercial cooking, which were tomato pickle making, masala powder for curry making and Idly powder making. Everyone was excited! These women were also happy that they can prepare these dishes for their family without purchasing from a shop and save money. Some were interested to make this as their home based business and market in their locality. We will wait to hear their success stories.



Here is a testimony from Rachel!

"My name is Rachel I come from Arcot Village. I was very passionate of learning new skills for a long time and I could not find a right place to learn these skills. When my friends make baskets, I watch them and become passionate of learning but no one was ready to teach me. Then through one of my contact, I heard that in Rantham village basket making and many other skills are going to be

taught for free, especially for women. It was my dream come true and today I attended this training program. This is very useful and we can do this from home and make some extra money. Especially commercial cooking was another interesting skill that I learnt today. For any of these training, generally we have to pay a huge amount to develop our skills, but this was free and has helped me to develop my skills for free. I am sure this training program will help me to increase our family income in the future and also I can be a mentor for those who are interested to learn. I am so thankful to God that I got an opportunity to attend this program and also I am thankful to Ebendavid Charities for conducting such program".



Here is a testimony from Maria!

"My name is Maria I am from Thalangai Village. Today, I attended this micro training program and all the skills that were taught today were very useful for me. I am a house wife and I had no idea that these skills can be learnt and done from home. I liked all the skills taught here but my special interest was in learning to prepare pickle from tomato and making cooking curry powders from home much



cheaper than buying from shops. This micro training program helped us to learn how these can be prepared at home and this was very useful for me. I also learnt how the waste materials such as newspaper, ice cream sticks can be utilized for decorations. This too was very useful for all of us. We wish that more such programs can be organized in the future and many of us can learn more skills and make use of them to earn our daily bread. We are thankful to Ebendavid Charities for conducting this micro training program in our village".

Education fee support program:

As the commencement of a new academic year is fast approaching, we are working on screening of the candidates to provide education support in the new academic year. All the students who were supported last year and have achieved good academic results will continue to get support for the next academic year too, if their course continues and their parent's financial situation remains the same. In addition to this, we need to support some new deserving applicants too. Hence our education program budget for this year is increasing! Your generous support is solicited!

Here is a testimony from Asha of Rajamundary dist. in Andhra Pradesh.

I was studying Inter MPC 2^{nd} year, when I received fee support from Ebendavid for the last academic year. I have now completed my course with a score of 96%. Though I need financial support, hoping that someone will help, I have applied for engineering courses in chitoor district (AP). I have also successfully passed in the entrance exam and I am now waiting for the counseling call. I wanted to become an Engineer in Computer Science. This is my dream.



Here is a testimony from Roshine of Ambathur (Chennai) in Tamil Nadu.

I am studying B.Sc (Computer Science). When I found it difficult to pay my semester fees due to a financial crisis in my family, I received support from Ebendavid Charities to pay my semester fees during the last academic year. And now I have successfully completed the 2^{nd} year of my course without any interruptions. I have also done well in my exams and I am waiting for my results to enter my final year. My ambition after completing my graduation is to become a Software Engineer.
